Board of Selectmen and Budget & Advisory Committee Minutes of Meeting Thursday, February 1, 2018

Selectmen Present: Chairman Brad Howell, Abigail Arnold and Henry Kunhardt

BAC member present: Chairman Charlie Pyle, Stuart Brock, Judi Miller and Tom Anderson

Others Present: Town Administrator Jamie A Pike

Chairman Howell called the meeting to order at 5:30pm.

New Business:

A motion was made by Mr. Kunhardt and seconded by Ms. Arnold to approve a <u>Demolition Permit for</u> <u>Sleeper Mill Farm (Map 8 Lot 85</u>) with the condition that there shall be no mechanized excavation or disturbance of earth without an approved shoreland permit. **Motion passes.**

A motion was made by Ms. Arnold and seconded by Mr. Howell to approve a <u>Building Permit for Robert</u> <u>Alsberg (Map 5 Lot 63)</u>. **Motion passes.**

A motion was made by Mr. Howell and seconded by Ms. Arnold to approve two Timber Tax Warrants: Chad & Debra Mills (Map 2 Lot 2-1) \$1,791.88 CDM Properties (Map 2 Lot 2) \$521.93

Motion passes.

To open the budget portion of the meeting, Mr. Kunhardt provided a synopsis of the planning work and bid process for the Police Station renovations to date. The Board has reviewed potential deduct and additions to the project from the bids received. The Board agreed to accept the three project deducts: ceiling tiles (\$9,300), flooring tiles (\$4,600) and removal of the concrete apron at the front of the building (\$1,800). A fourth deduct was presented to replace the proposed 6ton HVAC system with a smaller 3 season system. This would save \$12,600. The disadvantage of the smaller system is that there is no expansion potential to include the upper floor at a future time. Also the smaller system will rely heavily on the existing boiler during the winter months. It has also been presented to replace the existing boiler with a more efficient propane boiler at a cost of \$4,100. The Board agreed to move forward with the smaller HVAC system and to upgrade the existing boiler. It has additionally been proposed to move and upgrade the existing electric service. Additional details on this proposal are needed before a decision can be made. With these changes and the addition of a 10% owner contingency and asbestos removal, the project budget was set at \$170,000.

The Boards reviewed the proposed warrant article for the 2018 Town Meeting and voted their recommendations upon each.
