

Class A Trails:

Before placing restrictions on the use of Driscoll Hill Road, I want to provide a synopsis on Class A Trails in Frankestown.

The Town currently has 5 sections of Class A Trails:

1. Candlewood Hill Road – from the end of the Class V section to the Weare town line.
2. Dennison Pond Road – from the end of the Class V section to the Weare town line.
3. Cressy Hill Road – from Betsy Hardwick’s driveway to the Lyndeborough town line.
4. Farrington Road – from the end of the Class V section to the Town Forest. (This could use clarification as the Town Forest is just passed the Coffin property (Map 1 Lot 14).)
5. Driscoll Hill Road – from its intersection with Birdsall Road to a point 260 feet North-West of Russell Station Road.

Signs at Cressy Hill Road and Dennison Pond Road, prior to 2016 read as:

1. Dennison Pond Road

On May 25, 2016, the Select Board voted to replace the signs at Cressy Hill Road and Dennison Pond Road, and add a sign at Candlewood Hill Road that read as:



Pursuant to RSA 231-A:4, Public Trail Use Restrictions may include, but are not limited to:

1. Prohibition of motor vehicles, and
2. Prohibition of wheeled vehicles, and
3. Prohibition of off highway recreational vehicles (OHRV's); or,

Restriction to specified modes of travel such as:

1. Horse, and
2. Bicycle, and
3. Foot.

I feel the "Public Trail Use Restrictions", should be made clear and as prohibitive of uses or restrictive to specified uses.
